Thank you for your interest in obtaining a City of Henderson Animal Breeder's Permit. This letter will explain the process and some of the basic requirements.

With an approved permit, you will be allowed to maintain anywhere from one to five dogs and/or cats over four months of age, capable of breeding, whether actually breeding or not.

All dogs and cats on your property must be microchipped and the microchip number listed on the application.

To apply for a breeder's permit, you must:

1. Complete an application (all entries must be filled out, initialed where necessary and the application signed)
2. Submit the application with your state issued ID, in person, at the Henderson Animal Care and Control Facility located at 300 E. Galleria Drive in Henderson.
3. Be sure to list ALL dogs and cats on the property, even if they are spayed or neutered.
4. Pay the non-refundable \$100 application fee.
5. Purchase any and all pet licenses not already obtained for the rest of your pets. (This will require you to also bring proof of a current rabies vaccine for each pet)

After submitting your documents and paying all applicable fees, Animal Control will review the application. This process includes a person and property background check for:

1. Prior animal related complaints in Henderson; and
2. Violations of any federal, state, or local laws relating to animals; and
3. Domestic violence or any other similar physical violence related offenses within the previous five years; and
4. An inspection of your pet(s) and property including microchip verification.

If your application is approved, you will be issued a Breeders Permit valid for one year. If the application is denied, you must sterilize your pet(s) or file an appeal in accordance with Henderson Municipal Code 7.04.140 section C.

The application must be submitted EVERY year and renewal of the permit is the sole responsibility of the permit holder. Failing to maintain a current Breeder's Permit while possessing an unsterilized pet on property can result in citations and denial of future applications.
